Dr. Dohm moves to support SB 2306 and would like to relay to the Committee that the Board supports the expeditious licensing of military spouses but must remain focused on protecting the public. The Board cannot grant licenses, provisional licenses or temporary licenses where proof of license requirements that are required of all other applicants, have not been provided to the Board. Practitioners providing irreversible and surgical procedures must be evaluated prior to providing such services to ND citizens. The Board would request to remove the overstrike on lines 13-20 since the Board of Dentistry currently has procedures related to expeditious, temporary or provisional licensure in place that the bill calls for. Therefore, the Board would request to be exempted out of the first section of the bill regarding foreign practitioners and exempted out of the second portion of the bill that would alter or eliminate requirements boards use to assure public safety when licensing members of the military and spouses. The rules of the Board are inclusive of military and foreign applicants. Dr. Evanoff seconded the motion.

Discussion; the Board supports the spirit of the bill and acknowledges the importance and urgency of the issue. However, dentists performing surgical and irreversible procedures require the same due diligence by licensing boards with respect to their mission to protect the public. The board is not in favor of many aspects of the legislation as currently written. The board has taken steps to streamline their licensing process by granting license to applicants as soon as all requirements are met rather than waiting for a meeting of the Board and the Board currently accepts all dental regional clinical exams; many states do not. The Board also licenses by credential review. Several measures shown in SB 2306 are already provided for in NDCC 43-20 and NDCC 43-28 as well as Admin Rules. Chapter 43-51 addresses foreign practitioners and seven boards were exempt. (RCV): Marsh, yes; Dohm, yes; Mehlhoff, yes; Goebel, yes; Evanoff, yes. Motion carried, 5-0-2.
